1 Decide what media is critical to record: variation is key.

enhance your educational strategy by recording content effective for all types of learners. Find software that allows you to record your tablet, whiteboard, document camera, monitor, and yourself of course.

2 Consider how to break up the recording to make the replay experience efficient for your students.

4 Find technology that is adaptive and can work in virtual, hybrid and, in-person classroom settings.

Implementing new technologies is expensive and time-consuming. Find recording software that can be used when you're teaching virtually and in the classroom tomorrow.

5 Store your recordings in a secure, easy-to-navigate library.

Set up a secure media library that allows you to share recordings with students securely.
